Zim Logistics Network (ZLN) Acquires American West Worldwide Express

In a move that will extend their global reach for specialty LTL, ZLN (A subsidiary of ZIM Integrated Shipping Services) acquired American West Worldwide Express, a California based premium LTL freight transportation company, on July 20, 2007. ZLN acquired Interlog USA, a Minneapolis based international freight forwarder in late 2006. The acquisition comes at a time when shippers are requiring sophisticated global logistics solutions combined with excellent customer service that can not be met by larger companies.
